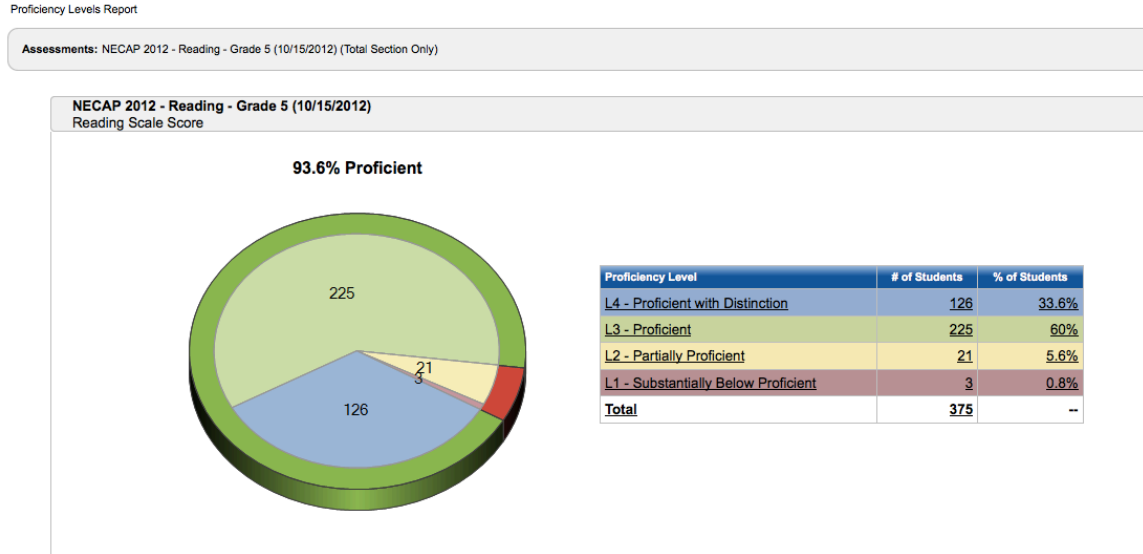


Creating a Proficiency Pie Chart Report

What this report look like.



This report gives you the big picture so you can see how your students did in on a particular assessment in terms of proficiency. A teacher might want to run this report for the class she taught. For example a 4th grade teacher might want to see how their students did on the 5th grade NECAP the following Fall, since it would be assessing what they learned in 4th grade. A principal might want to run this report for grades 3-8 for their whole school to get a sense of how the students did in each grade. A Special Education teacher might want to run this report on just their students to see how they did the year following their work with them.

Running this report:

You begin by logging into P+ using the Single Sign On (SSO)

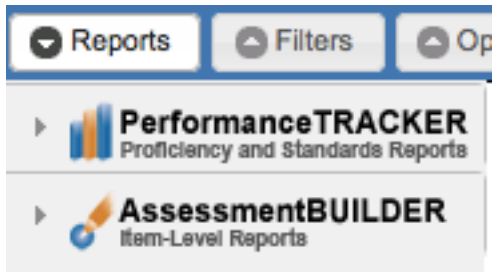
If you have multiple districts in your SAU, you might want to run your report with one district. To do that select Data View in the icons at the top and then select the district you want to work with.

You will now select the Reports icon to begin.

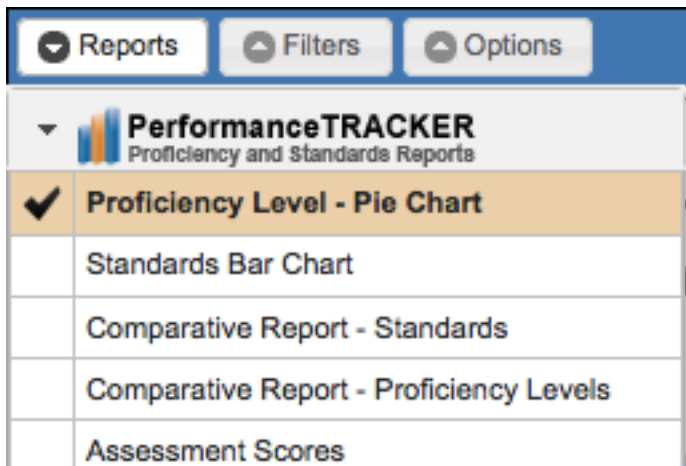


At the very top you will see any reports you have saved in My Reports. You can collapse that section by clicking on the little triangle to the left of it.

To run a report, you first need to select which report you want to run. Your choices are from Performance Tracker (Proficiency and Standards Reports) or Assessment Builder (Item- Level Reports).



You will select from Performance Tracker the Proficiency Level – Pie Chart report by clicking on it.



The next thing you want to do is select which assessment(s) you want to use to run with this report. For this example, we will use:

- Year 2013
- Subject – Reading
- Grade – 5
- Series – NECAP

When you have selected what you want, click show assessments.

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You should then see the 5th Grade NECAP for Reading. Click on the check box to the left to select it.

It is always a good idea to check Options to make sure you will get the data you really want from the report. In this example it is a simple report with few options. In this case we can leave the results shown as counts, meaning how many students were in each level of proficiency. Your other choice is percentages to show what percentage of students fell into each level of proficiency.

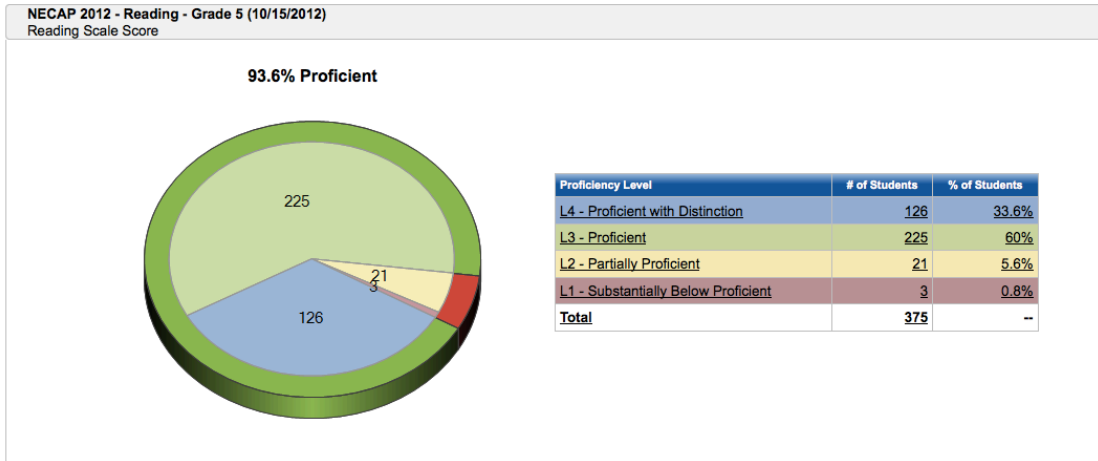

Now to run the report, you slide to the right and click on Run Report.

Your report should look like this:



Just as in the old reporting engine you have the slices of the pie showing how many students were in each level of proficiency. What is new is that you have outer rings. The red ring is for all those students who were non-proficient. The green ring is for the students who were proficient.

You can click on a slice of the pie to see the students in any level. You can click in the outer rings to see the students who are either proficient or non-proficient.

Further, you can click on any student to get to their individual student portfolio and look at how they did on all assessments, run other reports on them and look at much more.

You could always create a focus group of the students who were non-proficient and explore further to find what standards or questions gave these students problems. This along with other data can help inform your instruction.

You might also want to create a focus group of the proficient students to see those students' scores on the assessment. A good report for seeing that would be the Assessment Scores report. You would want to work very closely with any students who just made proficiency to insure they maintain proficiency.
